




























How did Wye School begin?

In 2011, a group of parents and members of the Wye community identified a need and strong demand for high-quality school places in the Ashford area. Together with United Learning, an organisation with an outstanding record for excellence in education going back 130 years, the Wye Free School Group submitted a successful bid to the Department for Education to open a Secondary Free School in Wye.

After a great deal of hard work and many anxious moments, the school opened in September 2013 with its first 90 students.

In January 2019, the story began a new chapter as all the temporary buildings disappeared one by one and students and staff were able, at last, to move into the beautiful new building.




Academic: 2018 GCSE results

- our students achieved a P8 score of + <u>0.3</u>, which was significantly higher than any other local non-selective school and higher than two of the three local grammar schools
- 81% got grade 4+ in English, the equivalent of the old C grade
- 76% grade 4+ in Maths
- 76% of our Year 11s sat the academic EBACC GCSE subjects Maths, English, Science, a humanity and a language, compared to a national average of 38%
- 100% of our students who sat the three sciences, Biology, Chemistry and Physics, got grade 4 or higher

Celebrations are underway at Wye School after its second set of GCSE students secure very strong results.


These showed that this year 72% of students achieved five or more good passes (grade 4 or above) including English and maths – an increase on last year.

On the government's Basics measure, which represents the combined English and maths score, the school also saw improvements. 78% of students achieved at least a pass (grade 4 or above) in both English and maths. Half of all students (49%) also achieved the higher level pass of grade 5 or above in both subjects.

Notable individual successes include:

- Sophie Wildman, who achieved two 9s in Geography and English Literature, three 8s, three 7s and two 6s;
- India Niles, who achieved two 9s in Maths and Chemistry, three 8s, one 7, one 6, one 5 and two 4s;
- Amelia Pullen, who achieved two 9s in English Language and English Literature, three 7s, four 6s and one 5;
- Nathan Stacey, who achieved three 8s in Physics, Maths and Chemistry, three 7s, two 6s, one 5 and one 4;
- Joel Dawkins, who achieved four 8s in Maths, Chemistry, Biology and Sport, two 7s, one 6, two 5s and one 4.

However for many, today was a day of celebration, including at **Wye School** which had its very first batch of A Level results, having opened seven years ago.

The secondary was celebrating today as 93% of the students who applied will be starting courses at their first-choice universities, with 50% destined for Russell Group institutions.



Principal Luke Magee said: "It is a very proud moment as a head teacher to see your first ever cohort taking their next steps towards successful adult lives, with the vast majority securing their first-choice university and at some of the country's best institutions.

"Whilst it is of course sad to say goodbye to our establishing cohort, we hope our 2020 leavers will look back with pride at how they have coped during these unusual and challenging circumstances and be happy with how they have supported one another through it.

"As our Sixth Form continues to grow, we very much look forward to welcoming our younger year groups safely back next month and continuing our focus on high academic standards and delivering an education with character."


WYE SCHOOL MARKS UNIVERSITY SUCCESS AS STUDENTS RECEIVE A LEVELS

~ Sixth Formers' hard work pays off as they take up places at King's College, Leeds and Manchester amongst others~

Sixth Formers at Wye School are set to take up places at some of the UK's top universities, as they receive their A Level grades today.

Assessed Grades (TAGs) due to the cancellation of external examinations. At Wye School, students sat in-

class exams and completed coursework as part of this assessment process.





Among those celebrating at Wye School were:

- Sophie Wildman, who received As in Chemistry, Maths and Spanish, and will be taking up a place at Manchester University to study Chemistry;
- Anais Bouchat, who received As in English Literature, History and Maths, and has secured a place at Leeds University to study Law;
- Amelia Pullen, who received an A* in English Literature, an A in Biology and a B in Chemistry, and will be going to King's College to study Pharmacy;
- Abi Holroyde, who received an A* in Art, an A in English Language and a B in English Literature, and will be taking up a place at Kent University to study Architecture;
- Lara Norris, who received an A* in Politics, an A in English Language and a B in Geography, and will be going to Sussex University this autumn to study Politics.

80% of students got into their first choice university, incuding Russell Group universities such as Cardiff, Newcastle, King's College London, Leeds, Manchester and Nottingham.
