NHS CADETS - Youth programme providing opportunities to explore roles in healthcare



NHS Cadets is a programme for young people (14-18) from all backgrounds. During this programme, you will learn practical skills for a future in healthcare and explore the different roles within the NHS. NHS Cadets meet in groups of 20-30 throughout school term time, one evening per week.

Over the course of 36 weeks, you will take part in a range of 90-minute sessions delivered by your youth leaders. In these sessions, you will do lots of different activities to develop your healthcare knowledge such as research tasks, debates, games, and quizzes.

The programme is split into two pathways: Foundation and Advanced.

<u>Super-curricular</u> - If you are hoping to go on to university post-18, it is essential to demonstrate you have engaged with your subjects outside of the taught curriculum. This could be wider reading, watching videos online, listening to a podcast, attending a lecture series, entering academic competitions.

<u>CXK</u> is a charity that delivers career guidance & training programmes to support individuals to build the skills & confidence they need. They provide our independent careers advice and guidance and the <u>CXK Blog</u> provides regular updates for young people and their parents/carers.

The <u>National Careers Service</u> provide careers information, advice, and guidance. It can help you to make decisions on learning, training, and work at all stages in your career. The Service has a useful tool to help support people in helping to determine what careers they might be suited to.

<u>Pathway CTM</u> are an award-winning social enterprise that provides employment, training, support and opportunities for schools and students. They connect young people, schools & parents with

leading global brands. They also provide employability skills training, free careers events, work experience & apprenticeship opportunities, and a mentor programme.

<u>SkillsBuilder</u> is a global movement of employers, educators, and impact organisations working together to ensure that one day, everyone builds the essential skills to succeed. The framework is centred around developing eight core skills.

Students are all given access to <u>Unifrog</u> from Year 7, to identify opportunities that link to their future. In KS3 and KS4, students are encouraged to use the platform to research different careers via the Careers Library and research what different subject areas at Higher Education involve via the Subjects Library.

MyPath has hundreds of videos available around specific careers. Their <u>Job of the Week</u> resource offers labour market information about a new job each week.

<u>KentChoices</u> is a free online prospectus and application system for young people to apply to sixth forms, colleges, training providers and apprenticeships.

The <u>UCAS</u> website provides information about universities and university courses, as well as information about student accommodation and finance. You can also chat with current university students.
